

# 3.0 Decision by Expert Group:

- A Simplified FPIC Approach is a requirement of the RSPO Independent Smallholder (ISH) Standard 2019.
  - Indicator 2.2 E requires for existing plots, smallholders can demonstrate that they have not acquired land without FPIC of indigenous peoples, local communities or other users.
  - Indicator 2.5 E requires for new oil palm planting, smallholders commit not to clear or acquire land from indigenous peoples, local communities, or other users without their FPIC, based on a simplified FPIC approach
- Based on these requirements and taking into account the needs of an Independent Smallholder, "the exemption of an ISH who has legal title of the land owned from carrying out FPIC" is put forward as a proposal.



- Initial feedback: The proposal Is moving in the right direction, however, a little more caveat is required.
- Discussion on the initially proposed 20-year period by MC was carried out looking at regional contexts.
- Examples were given by Expert Group members for regional context on how land is obtained by smallholders and if proof of



ownership can be shown.

- Point raised on how to confirm the land is free of conflict/ dispute even when legal tittle is present.
- It was also raised that if there is no contestation on the land and there is not legal title, National Interpretation will have to decided what kind of legality is acceptable (For the Indonesian/Colombian/ DRC context – Could include More Countries)
- In terms of FPIC, it was also raised that in many cases
   Smallholders are also part of the communities they operate in.
- It was agreed that 20 years is too long and will not qualify many smallholders looking at the past issues related to justifiable reasons (violence) for abandoning land.
- A major point was raised on the ownership of the land in the flow chart. In some regions, the land is never owned, but a smallholder may have operated on the land for a long period of time and given the right to continue operating by the local authority when no claims is raised on the land. Based on this it was suggested that instead of land ownership, it should be amended to right to use the land (legal or customary right to use the land).
- The Expert group agreed to change the initial question in the flowchart to "Do you have the legal or customary right to use the land (including set asides) you have developed or plan to develop for oil palm?"
- Proposal to add in the requirement for proof of absence of dispute and dispute resolution process as part of the flowchart was agreed by the Expert Group.

The Flowchart will be updated to reflect the agreed proposal to amend the question to reflect the legal or customary right to use the land and proof for absence of dispute.
