The Chair also reminded everyone that the Committee uses consensus-based decision making, and any Conflicts of Interest (CoI) should be declared.

The Committee went through the draft meeting minutes of the meeting held on 25th January 2021 with a request for an amendment by a Member on Page 9. MoM is accepted with the amendment.

3.0 (Discussion) Updates from Secretariat. Q&A Session

3a Updated on the number of ISH applications. 6.8% of membership growth within the past 3 months

3b Livelihood program - Smallholder Trainer Academy

- 7,342 participants are reported to have undergone training with
 166 training events took place as of Jan 2021
- GIZ-SCPOPP Thailand conducted 123 trainings from September-December 2020; trained 6,139 participants
- Currently developing a virtual training plan with the RSPO capacity development unit
- Revising contents of the STA Smallholder Training guide and group training guide for an update

3c Smallholder Certification

78.4% increase in CSPO volumes for ISH and 10.2% in certified volumes of scheme SH between Jan 2020 and 2021.

 A Member noted an important point in going forward: it should be reported on how many groups are in Eligibility, how many countries are in Milestone A, and etc; to keep visibility of progress.

3d Updates on the development of simplified HCV-HCS assessment

- Further development is required for the components that have been identified in the draft proposal
- Announcement for an expression of interest has been put up on the website and invites has been sent out to consultants with known experience in the field of industry
- Work plan:
 - 12 March 2021 Deadline for expression of interest
 - 10 May 2021 Deadline for completion of further development
 - Public consultation and field testing
 - Finalisation of Simplified Combined HCV-HCS Approach

The SHSC Members in the IS-NDTF to channel the comments regarding the document from the SHSC when it is finalised and reviewed.

Work Plan

- Translation to Spanish, French, Thai and Bahasa Indonesia is in progress.
- Public Consultation: tentatively planned for the mid of March
 2021 For 30 days
- Pilot testing potential to be carried out during the public consultation

Public Consultation (30 days) is tentatively planned for 19th of March 2021

The 4th Expert Group Meeting will tentatively be held after the public consultation period.

- Development is overseen by the Subgroup of Peatland Working Group
- Development of ISH Peat BMP
 - Independent Smallholder Best Management Practices (BMPs) for existing oil palm cultivation on peat - Final Draft
 - Flood Risk Assessment Template Final Draft
- Public consultation will begin in Mid-march

Updates on SH Program for Indonesia

3g

- Two series of Internal Audit Training was conducted in South Sumatra and Riau Province. 23 Groups representative including 7 new potential members.
- 40 smallholder group profiles and success stories are commissioned for writing. It will be featured in the upcoming SH Hub to improve RSEP content.
- Legal firm has been appointed to carry out a comprehensive
 Indonesian legal analysis against the ISH Standard
- RISS NI vs LI will be decided by SSC next meeting

IS Credit market overview

3h

Credit transactions are off to a very strong start this year. In January alone, 21,553 IS-CSPO credits were traded, which corresponds to almost a quarter of last year's total number.

The IS-CSPO average price was 16.3 USD which is 26% higher than last year's average

RSPO Smallholder Engagement Platform

3i

- The RSEP currently has a very low number of Facilitator and



- Market Player registered compared to the 11 smallholder groups registered
- As of June last year, the Secretariat has started reviewing how the RSEP can be promoted better. The aim is to increase exposure for ISH groups and encourage more active players to register
- As part of the revamp of the Smallholder Hub, the RSEP is being factored in as an element that will be more visible to audiences
- The SH Hub revamp work is currently ongoing since April 2020 and the targeted end product is providing a one-stop Centre reference on all RSPO Smallholder-related information

4.0 (Decision) Interpretation on internal audit requirements

Petite Comite Discussion

- ICS B1.1 MS B: The ICS is implemented and an annual internal audit of the group is conducted for all group members and all audit findings are resolved
- Proposed Interpretation of ICS B1.1 MS B
 - Compliance against the requirement of ICS B1.1 MS B shall be shown by completing an internal audit for all group members by:
 - The first annual surveillance audit (i.e. ASA 1) for New ISH Groups
 - The second surveillance audit (i.e. ASA 2) for Existing ISH Groups transitioning from the RSPO Management System Requirements and Guidance for Group Certification of FFB Production to the RSPO ISH Standard
- For the consecutive annual surveillances of the certificate, the group manager shall carry out a risk assessment of the ISH group members. High and medium risk group members shall be audited annually.
- The risk assessment shall consider diversity as well as the perceived risk relating to the activities undertaken by group members and previous year's internal and external audit results.
- A minimum of 33% of the group members will be required to be audited annually. This includes new members being added to the ISH Group.

Risks associated with Interpretation

- Noncompliance to the requirements by some members of the group who are not audited annually.

Implication of Interpretation

- Increase in ISH Groups being certified as a result of reduction in



the cost of certification (i.e. reduction in resources/capacity needed to conduct internal audit)

Action Requested from the SHSC

- RSPO Secretariat requests approval from the SHSC on this proposed interpretation

Decision: Taking into consideration of the transition process with the new requirements, the proposed interpretation is **accepted**.

5.0 (Decision) Update & discussion RSSF Funding and Governance Policy

The SHSC Lead gave a recap of what happened during the last meeting in regards to this issue.

Presented the RSSF reactivation operational (and revamp) plan to the Committee.

One of the Chairs wanted to note that the RSSF will be managed by RSPO, and the previous option of inviting an external consultant for the management of the RSSF is no longer considered.

Interim Solution to provide funds to ISH

- 1. Financial assistance size and fund origin
 - Total amount is USD 350 000. Needs to be confirmed by finance, and could change depending on fund availability
 - Funds come from the Secretariat's operational budget, including CEO's budget surplus.
 - Allocation requires a budget requisition from the RSPO's CEO.
- 2. Financial assistance allocation criteria



- ISH Groups are the only beneficiaries
- Certified ISH groups will get more than non-certified.
- To ensure fair distribution, the certified area size will be taken into account as an allocation criterion.
- Minimal or non-existent paperwork burden for ISH groups

3. Fund Allocation proposal

- Membership fee waiver (78 ISH groups paying a total of USD 46 000 per year)
- Hardship allowance due to the covid crisis.

The table above shows the distribution of financial aid based on total area certified by country.

Decision: The proposal was unanimously accepted.

6.0 SH representation in the BoG

1. RSPO Statutes

- 11. (b) Each Ordinary Member may only elect a member within their own sector and sub-sector as specified in Article 6(e) to the Board of Governors. However, Oil Palm Growers - Small Grower members as per article 6(e)(i)(i.iv)
- 6. (e)(i)(i.iv) The interested party that is applying to become Ordinary Members must specify and qualify for one of the following sectors and sub-sectors;
 - (i) Oil Palm Growers:
 - (i.i) Oil Palm Growers Malaysia
 - (i.II) Oil Palm Growers Indonesia
 - (i.iii) Oil Palm Growers Rest of the World
 - (i.iv) Oil Palm Growers Smallholder Group Manager
 - (i.v) Oil Palm Growers Small Grower

2. Smallholder Group Manager and Small Grower Membership

- As of today, there are 78 smallholder groups that are active members of the RSPO
- The majority of smallholder groups are from Indonesia



and Thailand

3. The BoG will develop a proposal for effective SH representation.

The CEO had previously met with the two BoG Chairs to discuss this issue and it was decided that the Board will be able to select the representative, but will work in tandem with the SHSC.

Next steps: A call should be scheduled between with the SHSC Co-Chairs, SHSC Secretariat Lead, RSPO CEO and BoG Co-Chairs to determine the best way to come up with a proposal that is within the interpretation of the Statutes, and have it ready before the next General Assembly.

Secretariat lead to set up a meeting with the relevant peoples to carry out the next steps.

Ideally, the 78 ISH groups would be able to form their own constituency and select their own representative to the BoG.
