	SY updated the members on matters from BoG meeting recently in Armsterdam.				
	<ul> <li>Budget – RSPO Technical to rework on a more realistic budget. SY suggested the budget submitted by FLTTF must be clear in terms of cost and expenses. FLTTF can proceed with the current proposed budget but not to go beyond it.</li> </ul>				
	<ul> <li>New IT trading platform – the attempt to combine the current 2 platform (Green Palm and UTZ) did not work. UTZ given 18 months to come out with the new platform covering both physical and certificate trading.</li> </ul>				
	<ul> <li>RSPO + - should not undermine the conventional RSPO. BoG to endorse it in the next RT (Nov 2015) and to be up &amp; running starting 1 January 2016.</li> </ul>				
	Re-organisation of RSPO Secretariat – to double number of staffs in 2 to 3 years, worldwide				
	<ul> <li>NI Endorsement - Approval of NI for Honduras and PNG. Indonesia NI has not been endorsed but issues been resolved.</li> </ul>				
	• Compensation procedures – members been suspended due to non-submission of liability disclosure				





	<ul> <li>NPP - BoG has agreed that the NPP document to be updated. Draft document to be submitted to Grower BoG members for review prior to public consultation.</li> <li>Jurisdictional Certification approach – Sabah and Kalimantan Tengah is moving towards Jurisdictional Certification.</li> </ul>					
	<ul> <li>Discussion:</li> <li>Due to the new trading platform development, Green Palm will no longer be in the picture. However, certificate trading will still be a feature in RSPO certification and Green Palm may remain as RSPO logo, depending on how the new platform and Green Palm will work through.</li> </ul>					
4	Agenda 1: RoW Consultancy Work PG presented the matrix comparing the 2 proposals received from FoodReg and Daemeter et. al. (consortium), followed by SWOT discussion of each proposal. Members later requested to choose.					
	Majority of the members agreed to go for Daemeters but with provision on the budget. Hence, which consultant to be appointed could only be decided upon getting clarity on the matter (provision on the budget).					
5	Agenda 2: (a) PowerPoint presentation on "Defining Legality" by Ell (Joko Arif)					
	<ul> <li>Will define Legality from 3 category:         <ol> <li>Location and land clearing</li> <li>Product processing</li> <li>Marketing and transportation</li> </ol> </li> <li>Will do legal review and case studies from 2 sites in Indonesia: Kalimantan and Sumatera.</li> <li>Through peer review/workshop with other stake holders, EII will formulate and suggest definition of Legal FFB and recommend solution to solve illegality of FFB.         <ol> <li>Example of solutions:                 <ul> <li>By using the current 4 Ministers Joint Decree on acknowledgement of community right.</li> <li>Legality issue will be easier to be solved by using jurisdictional approach (eg: IP4T for village)</li> </ul> </li> </ol></li></ul>					
	<ul> <li>Discussion:</li> <li>EII will involve mills and smallholders especially in case studies. For Kalimantan, the study will be focusing in Kotawaringin Barat, Central Kalimantan where EII have already started some works and have resources on the ground. Some mills have already been identified. As for Sumatera, EII will ask for guidance from the task force.</li> <li>For one site (mill and its supply base) the study will take around 15 days.</li> </ul>					
	<ul> <li>Decision:</li> <li>Task force approved the proposal; EII to proceed with the study</li> <li>Output from this study as input for RoW study for consistency</li> <li>Output for Indonesia and generic application on definition of legality.</li> <li>There must be explicit collaboration with Government</li> <li>There may be a need to bring this up to NI level at later stage</li> </ul>					
	<ul> <li>(b) PowerPoint presentation on "Detailing the Process Traceability in Indonesia" by WWF Indonesia (Rizkiasari Joedawinata)</li> <li>To safeguard credibility issue especially in mass balance system whereas there is leakage issue of illegal FFB coming into the supply chain</li> </ul>					
	<ul> <li>To be built from existing traceability system, one strong inclusive traceability system that is workable by RSPO members</li> </ul>
