Mission Statement

To facilitate the resolution of disputes and management of conflicts between people and RSPO members, through a trusted, impartial and accessible process, resulting in compliance with RSPO standards, fair lasting solutions and the prevention of further social associated with palm production and consumption.

Terms of Reference for Advisory Group

1. Mission of Dispute Settlement Facility (DSF)

To facilitate the resolution of disputes and management of conflicts between people and RSPO members, through a trusted, impartial and accessible process, resulting in compliance with RSPO standards, fair lasting solutions and the prevention of further social associated with palm production and consumption.

2. Mandate of DSF Advisory Group

The DSF Advisory Group is to support the development of the RSPO DSF as an effective mechanism to fulfill its mission, and particularly as follows:

- 2.1 Analyse the relevance, effectiveness and impact of the RSPO DSF policies, procedures, operating tools;
- 2.2 Provide strategic guidance, recommendations and propose adjustments to the DSF policies, procedures and capacity as appropriate;
- 2.3 Support outreach and the promotion of the DSF as a useful mechanism for use by RSPO members and affected groups alike:
- 2.4 Provide advice and guidance to RSPO DSF on the management of a case or cases; and
- 2.5 The DSF Advisory Group reports to the DSF secretariat, and through the Secretariat, to the RSPO Executive Board.



3. Membership

- 3.1 Membership is open to all stakeholder groups represented within the RSPO;
- 3.2 Membership is by invitation and/or nomination by the RSPO membership sector, the DSF secretariat will seek to balance representation by stakeholder group, but this is not compulsory. The priority is to have a membership with the knowledge, skills and experience¹ needed to contribute effectively to the mission of the DSF and mandate of the Advisory Group;
- 3.3 Membership of the AG is on a voluntary basis and members are asked to serve for at least 2 years; and
- 3.4 AG members may be called upon to serve on a DSF Ad-hoc Expert Panel².

4. Meetings & Decision Making

- 4.1 The AG will have a physical meeting at least once a year and by telephone and/or Internet conferences periodically;
- 4.2 Meetings are to be coordinated by the DSF secretariat;
- 4.3 The DSF secretariat is to provide regular updates to the Advisory Group, at least every [4 months]; and
- 4.4 The AG will set its own protocols for decision-making at its first meeting.
